Atlantic City, N.J. – Monmouth County Service Supervisor Stacey Coder was honored by the Probation Association of New Jersey (PANJ) as the organization's "Supervisor of the Year" after being nominated by her peers in the Monmouth County Probation Division.

Brad Fairchild, president of PANJ, congratulated Coder for her exceptional leadership and devoted service to her colleagues and profession in the Monmouth vicinage.

"Ms. Coder's leadership skills within the Monmouth Vicinage are seen apparent through her efficient undertaking of the rigorous activities as Supervisor," said Fairchild. "The fact that she has been so appreciated by her peers is testament to her expertise and insight. We are proud to have such a strong-willed and reliable individual serving in the best interest of the community."

In nominating Ms. Coder for the award, members of her team admire her patience, kindness and respect for everyone that she comes in contact with. They also cite her insight and expertise in the court system, in which she organized a procedure across multiple teams and departments to ensure that court customers left the courthouse with a court date, maximizing the efficiency of the process. Even in times of difficult change due to the implementation of a new computer system, her peers praise her support, perspective and accommodation to a stressed staff.

Coder received the award at this year's 71st annual PANJ Educational Foundation training institute entitled "*Information-Interaction-Innovation*" which addresses new techniques and tools afforded to probation officers in the technological age.

At the gathering, outstanding leaders among probation officers and court supervisors, as well as Assembly Republican Leader Jon Bramnick, received awards for their commitment and dedication to supervising offenders.
