BURLINGTON COUNTY'S NICOLE YADLOSKY NAMED PROBATION OFFICER OF THE YEAR

65th Annual Training Conference in Atlantic City Honors Local Officer

Atlantic City, N.J. – Burlington County resident Nicole Yadlosky recently was honored by the Probation Association of New Jersey (PANJ) as the organization's "Probation Officer of the Year." Yadlosky was nominated by her peers throughout the state for her caring, hard-working, and relentless efforts as a juvenile probation officer with the Burlington County Juvenile Supervision unit.

"Nicole is passionate and conscientious about each juvenile under her care, and handles one of the largest and most active caseloads of any officer in the county. She goes above and beyond the call of duty to supervise juveniles in the probation system. On one of her vacation days, for instance, she visited one of the local high schools to meet with administrators to encourage the creation of more programs that are readily available for teenagers," said George Christie, president of PANJ.

Ms. Yadlosky received her award at PANJ's 65th annual training institute, "Everyone's a Star...What's Your Role," held from November 18 to 20. The annual training institute is a grassroots event sponsored by the PANJ Education Foundation to ensure that officers are given adequate training. Workshop topics include: Immigration and Deportation, Predatory Drug's the Rapist's Deadly Weapon, Psychiatric Illness & Substance Abuse, Internet Crime, Communicable Health Issues, and Profiling the Stalker.

The association named Assemblyman Gordon Johnson (D-Bergen) Legislator of the Year and named New Jersey 101.5's 'Big' Joe Henry Citizen of the Year. First Assistant Attorney General, John Vazquez, gave the keynote address on the state's crime prevention efforts. There are an estimated 2,800 probation officers and supervisors in New Jersey who oversee approximately 200,000 adult and juvenile probationers.
